Please find a reminder below about drafting reinstatement orders after dismissal. We have noticed several problems with these orders recently.

When drafting a reinstatement order, please check to see if the appellant's and appellee's briefs have already been filed in the case. The order would not contain language for filing briefs if the briefs have already been filed.

Also, please check to see if 20 days have passed since the original docketing of the case. If 20 days have expired and there was no request to argue filed, the parties do not get another chance to file a request for oral argument. If 20 days have expired, the order would not contain language giving the parties time to file for oral argument.
