EMERITUS, LTD., Trustee v. WATKINS LUMBER & SUPPLY CO., INC. CLERK COURT OF APPEALS OF GA.

From the Superior Court of Gilmer County.

Appellant filed this application for interlocutory appeal seeking review of the trial court's order denying its application for an interlocutory injunction to prohibit the sale of certain real property to satisfy a default judgment entered against it. Although appellant fails to state the basis for jurisdiction in this Court, it repeatedly claims in its application that its constitutional rights to due process have been violated and that it seeks equitable relief. On review, however, the application does not invoke this Court's constitutional question jurisdiction since the constitutional questions presented would require simply the application of well-settled constitutional principles to the facts of the case. See Zepp v. Mayor and Council of the City of Athens, 255 Ga. 449 (339 SE2d 576) (1986). Further, the application identifies no equitable issues sufficient to invoke this Court's jurisdiction under 1983 Ga. Const., Art. VI, Sec. VI, Par. III (2) ("Supreme Court shall have appellate jurisdiction of . . . [a]ll equity cases"). See Redfearn v. Huntcliff Homes Assn., Inc., 271 Ga. 745 (524 SE2d 464) (1999); Lee v. Green Land Co., Inc., 272 Ga. 107 (527 SE2d 204) (2000). Thus, this case hereby is transferred to the Court of Appeals for resolution.

JOHNNY REUTO v. THE STATE

From the Superior Court of Richmond County.

Appellant filed a notice of appeal from the trial court's order denying his motion to vacate void judgment and sentence. This Court previously transferred the application to appeal the same order. See Reuto v. State, S11D0480 (Oct. 10, 2010). Appellant's notice of appeal cites this Court's jurisdiction over habeas cases, but his motion to vacate void judgment and sentence was not treated and could not properly be treated as a habeas action for several reasons, including that it was not filed on the proper forms. See Jones v. Henderson, 285 Ga. 804 (684 SE2d 265) (2009). Furthermore, as Appellant was convicted on drug possession charges, not murder, and no other basis for jurisdiction in this Court appears in the record, Ga. Const. of 1983, Art. VI, Sec. VI, Para. II-III, the Court hereby directs that the appeal be transferred to the Court of Appeals.
