A Discretionary Application must be filed within 30 days of the stamped filed date on the order that you are appealing and the application must be accompanied by a proper Certificate of Service and a pauper's affidavit or the \$80.00 filing fee. You must also comply with all the other applicable rules of Court regarding filing with the Court of Appeals of Georgia.

presumed "transferred" with the application.


Although the rules state not to attach any document
to an appellate brief, the appellate deems it
necessary to show this Court, that this information
has already been submitted and referred to in
"Issue 3", "If the defendant has the responsibility
of filing motions and responding to notices in a timely
manner, shouldn't the trial court as well?", prior to her
Motion for Reconsideration, and it is imperative for
the continuation of her "Discretionary Application".

The Appellant also filed an "Amendment to Discretionary
Application" for the sake of not being dismissed
based on a technicality, to insure that she included
everything that was required by the Court of Appeals.
Again, a copy of the ~~motion~~^{denial} dated February 26th
2015, was already submitted with the application
originally sent to the Supreme Court of Georgia,

and the appellant, in her haste, neglected to submit another copy once the application was transferred, because she presumed that her documentation was forwarded along with the Discretionary Application for Appeal.

I am solely at the mercy of this Court, and ask that this Court will permit me to move forward with my "Discretionary Application for Appeal".
