See OCGA §5-6-37.** Once the trial court clerk has received and filed the Notice of Appeal, the trial court clerk will prepare a copy of the record and transcripts as designated by the Notice of Appeal and transmit them to this Court. Once the Notice of Appeal is docketed in the Court of Appeals of Georgia, a Docketing Notice with the Briefing Schedule and other important information is mailed to counsel for the parties or directly to the parties, if the parties are representing themselves. You do not need to provide this Court with a copy of the Notice of Appeal you filed with the superior court.
- The Notice of Appeal must include a proper Certificate of Service.** A Certificate of Service must show service to the opposing counsel and contain the counsel's full name and complete mailing address. The opposing counsel must actually be served with a copy of your filing.
- An Application for Writ of Habeas Corpus should be filed in the superior court of the county in which you claim you are illegally detained.** An appeal from a denial of an Application for Writ of Habeas Corpus is to the Supreme Court and not the Court of Appeals.
- An Application for Writ of Mandamus should be filed in the superior court of the county official whose conduct you intend to mandate.** An appeal from a denial of an Application for Writ of Mandamus is to the Supreme Court and not the Court of Appeals.
- Your appeal was disposed by opinion (order) on _____.** The Court of Appeals _____
_____ The remittitur issued on _____
divesting this Court of jurisdiction. The case decision is therefore final.
- Your mailing/documents indicate that you intended to file your papers in another court rather than the Court of Appeals of Georgia.** The address of the Clerk of the _____ is:
- If an attorney has been appointed for you and you are concerned with the representation provided by that attorney, you should address that issue to the trial court.** As long as you are represented by an attorney, you cannot file pleadings on your own behalf. Your attorney must file a Motion to Withdraw as Counsel and it must be granted, before you can file your own pleadings in this Court.
- A request for an out-of-time appeal should be made to the trial court from which you are appealing.** If your motion is denied by the trial court, you can file an appeal of that decision by filing a Notice of Appeal with the clerk of the superior court.

On January 9, 2015, the Clerk of this Court returned my "Motion-Request To Proceed In Forma Pauperis, And Instructions to The Trial Court To Send Up The Case For Appellate Review," with a notice that there is no case pending in the Court Of Appeals Of Georgia under my name. However, the Clerk did stamp the attached In Forma pauperis application as being received in your office on January 8, 2015. (See Request To Proceed In Forma pauperis application, attached to the enclosed motion styled to this Court).

To clarify the purpose of my enclosed motion; The trial Court, under Clayton County Superior Court case Number-2008-CR-01875-5, has denied my motion to arrest and set aside a void judgement (conviction) in that Court. Also, the trial Court refuses to allow me to appeal its denial in Forma pauperis. (See enclosed exhibits A-F, supporting motion styled to this Court).

The reason there is no case pending in This Court under my name is because the trial Court refuses to grant In Forma pauperis.

In the enclosed motion styled to the Court of Appeals of Georgia, I am asking this Court for a discretionary appeal... in hopes that the Court finds that I am entitled to a direct appeal.

A timely Notice of Appeal and affidavit of indigency was filed in the trial court. However, the trial court refuses to send up the case without, first, receiving filing fees from me, the appellant.

I submit that the enclosed In Forma pauperis application certifies that I am indigent as a matter of law and fact.

I hope the foregoing has clarified my intended actions. Please advise me if further action is required.
