While patrolling the 900 block of South Davis Street, I was travelling south and I observed a dark brown four door sedan vehicle failed to stop for the stop sign of Cherry Avenue and South Davis Street. I turned my vehicle around to initiate a traffic stop for the violation. I caught up with the vehicle at South Davis Street and West Broad Avenue where I initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle. As I exited my vehicle, the driver of the suspect vehicle also exited the driver side and attempted to walk away. I stopped the driver and ordered him to remain in the vehicle and he complied.

I then made contact with him and he produced a Florida driver's license #K520736623720. I then requested to identification from the rear passenger due to the fact that I was familiar with being on probation or parole. The rear passenger identified himself as, Marquise Hancock and he also produced a Georgia Department of Corrections Identification card. I walked around the vehicle and made contact with the front male passenger and while talking to her, I observed an opened pack of Newport Box cigarette between the armrest with a smoking device known as crack pipe exposed in plain view. I asked her if she was a crack smoker based on my observation of the smoking device which is commonly used to smoke illegal drugs. She replied yes that she does smoke crack.

I then removed all three occupants from the vehicle and I requested to speak to the driver, Mr. Roland individually. I asked Mr. Roland what was the reason why he tried to walk away from the vehicle but he could not provide an explanation. I asked him for consent to search the vehicle, he verbally provided me the consent to search the vehicle in the presence of Ptl. Glover. I first removed the Newport cigarette box from the vehicle and confirmed the content of it which was a used crack pipe and a push rod. Both devices appeared to be recently used. Next, I located a clear plastic bag under the driver seat that contained a green leafy like substance that smelled like Spice based on my training, knowledge and experience. Based on my observations, all three subjects were placed in investigative detention and secured in the back seat of Ptl. Glover and Ptl. Parker's police cars pending further investigation. I then made contact with Investigator Morred from the Albany Dougherty Drug Unit and request that all three subject be transported to the ADDU headquarters. The vehicle was towed by a non-preference, Peavey's Wrecker Services. The subjects along with the contrabands were turned over to Investigator Morred. This case remains active pending charges by ADDU investigation.

Evidence:

- 1- Plastic bag containing 11.5 grams of spice (synthetic marijuana) Tested positive with a NARK II 23-A and 23-B field test. It was placed in a heat sealed bag, sealed with evidence tape and marked for ID "JIM 7-9-15 15-00250. This item was logged as evidence at ADDU and will be sent to the crime lab for testing.
- 2- 4 rocks of cocaine total weight .9 grams. It was field tested by voltox showing positive for marijuana. It was placed in a heat sealed bag, sealed with evidence tape and marked for ID "JIM 7-9-15 15-00250. This item was logged as evidence at ADDU and will be sent to the crime lab for testing.
- 3- Homemade drug kit consisting of a Newport cigarette box that contained a smoking device and push rod. It was placed in a heat sealed bag, sealed with evidence tape and marked for ID "JIM 7-9-15 15-00250. This item was logged as evidence at ADDU.
- 4- (2) DVD recordings of Defendants King, Wallace and Hancock.

Sergeant Casseus stopped a 1983 Ford LTD, registration DP9BEL for a stop sign violation that took place at the intersection of Cherry Avenue and S Davis St.

During the course of this stop drugs were discovered (see report by Casseus)

I met Sergeant Casseus at the ADDU Office and field tested the drugs and took custody of the evidence.

The driver, B/M King, Rolland, a front seat passenger B/F Wallace, Sharon, and a rear seat passenger B/M Hancock, Marquis were all interviewed separately. They were read their 5th amendment rights and a rights waiver was completed. All subjects agreed to talk but denied knowledge of drugs.

All subjects were charged as indicated and transported to the DOCO for booking by APD uniform officers.


