See OCGA §5-6-37.** Once the trial court clerk has received and filed the Notice of Appeal, the trial court clerk will prepare a copy of the record and transcripts as designated by the Notice of Appeal and transmit them to this Court. Once the Notice of Appeal is docketed in the Court of Appeals of Georgia, a Docketing Notice with the Briefing Schedule and other important information is mailed to counsel for the parties or directly to the parties, if the parties are representing themselves. You do not need to provide this Court with a copy of the Notice of Appeal you filed with the superior court.
- The Notice of Appeal must include a proper Certificate of Service.** A Certificate of Service must show service to the opposing counsel and contain the counsel's full name and complete mailing address. The opposing counsel must actually be served with a copy of your filing.
- An Application for Writ of Habeas Corpus should be filed in the superior court of the county in which you claim you are illegally detained. An appeal from a denial of an Application for Writ of Habeas Corpus is to the Supreme Court and not the Court of Appeals.**
- An Application for Writ of Mandamus should be filed in the superior court of the county official whose conduct you intend to mandate.** An appeal from a denial of an Application for Writ of Mandamus is to the Supreme Court and not the Court of Appeals.
- Your appeal was disposed by opinion (order) on \_\_\_\_\_.** The Court of Appeals \_\_\_\_\_ The remittitur issued on \_\_\_\_\_ divesting this Court of jurisdiction. The case decision is therefore final.

I wish to appeal a decision that was made by the Superior Court of Clayton County to Dismiss my "Habeas Corpus 28 USC § 2241" a 'pre trial' Habeas Corpus. I am represented by a public defender and I have provided my public defender with a Motion to Dismiss and affidavits of facts concerning the same issues that I am filing my habeas corpus under, and ~~and~~ my public defender signed a affidavit of fact to verify that he received the motion to Dismiss along with the grounds in which I wrote the Motion.

My public defender never filed my motion or Affidavits of Fact so I filed them myself and everything that I filed was dismissed because the court said that I was represented by a public defender. When I filed my "Habeas Corpus 28 USC § 2241" it was under the same grounds that I filed my Motion to Dismiss, which ~~are~~ are for violations of my Constitutional rights and fraud. But when my "Habeas Corpus" was dismissed I was told that it was because "the procedure by trial and appeal should not be interfered with by a writ of Habeas Corpus, with there being another adequate remedy."
