- An Application for Writ of Habeas Corpus should be filed in the superior court of the county in which you claim you are illegally detained.** An appeal from a denial of an Application for Writ of Habeas Corpus is to the Supreme Court and not the Court of Appeals.
- An Application for Writ of Mandamus should be filed in the superior court of the county official whose conduct you intend to mandate.** An appeal from a denial of an Application for Writ of Mandamus is to the Supreme Court and not the Court of Appeals. MOTION TO APPEAL SENTENCE

Come now, I, JaQuann Micquel Orton, asking the courts of an appeal on a thirty year sentence I received on SEPTEMBER,17 2015. I was convicted of an armed robbery, hijacking a motor vehicle, and possession of a firearm or a knife during commission of or attempt to

commit certain felonies. However, I would like to appeal the case as a non-violent offender and first time offender diversion in which I am hoping for a lesser sentence.
