PHIPPS, Chief Judge.

Carey Ross was convicted of five counts of obstruction of an officer. He appeals, contending that inadmissible hearsay evidence prejudiced his defense. We affirm.

The obstruction charges stemmed from three separate incidents involving five different deputies. The incidents occurred on June 17, 2009, after Ross had been transported back to jail from a hospital, where he had stayed as an in-patient for two weeks.

At trial, after the deputies each testified about the incidents which led to the obstruction charges, the state rested its case, and Ross testified. He testified that during his interactions with deputies that day, he was on medication that had been
