



NASH R. BROYLES served on the Georgia Court of Appeals 1914-1947. He was born in Atlanta, October 16, 1868, and died April 7, 1947.

He was graduated from Boys High School in 1885; the University of Georgia with an A.B. degree in 1888 and a Bachelor of Law degree in 1889. He was a member of Chi Phi fraternity.

He married Deas Hall in 1894. She was from Charleston, S. C. One of his paternal ancestors was Governor of North Carolina, and among his maternal ancestors were generals in the military and members of the U. S. Congress.

He practiced law with his father, Edwin Nash Broyles, and his brother, Arnold Broyles. He was appointed United States Commissioner; elected City Recorder of Atlanta; elected Judge of the Court of Appeals of Georgia in 1914, serving over 32 years in that capacity; served as Presiding Judge for two years and as Chief Judge about 28 years on the Court of Appeals, which latter attainment may be a record. Sixty volumes of Appeals Reports were published during his tenure, which is another rare record with only six judges on the court. He was appointed one of the commissioners to pass upon the 1933 revision of the Code of Georgia.

A memorial dated November 4, 1947, is found in 75 Georgia Appeals Reports, pages 887-894. Expressions about his life there include: "A believer in the enforcement of the law, an opponent of trifling technicalities, an advocate of the punishment of the guilty as a protection to society." It was said: "His strength lay in his faith in the eternal principles of right and wrong." He "regarded the individual as at the apex of creation, and his rights and obligations were to be so measured." It was said that his judicial career and the influence of his life would continue to bless humanity as the North Star "continues to guard the mariner from the cruel rocks" even a million years after its light was extinguished. It was said "he was the soul of honor. He was just and fair in all his dealings. Rich and poor stood on an even balance with him in all his decisions."

Anne L. Shellman, and one of his sons, Shellman Boston, was a student in the University. He was a member of the Phi Kappa Society and the Chi Phi fraternity. He never cared much for debating, but occasionally wrote poetry, ^{He served} and accordingly ~~was chosen class poet~~. For a number of years he engaged in the railroad business and his later years were spent in Atlanta as a successful banker. On the occasion of a class reunion he was elected as president of the class to succeed Emmett J. Bondurant who had just died, and filled that position until his death a few years later.


NASH ROSE BROYLES ~~has~~ achieved probably more public distinction than any other member of the class of 1888. He was born in Atlanta in 1868, the son of Edwin Nash Broyles, one of the leading members of the Atlanta bar. He was my classmate for three years in the Boys High School in Atlanta, from which institution we graduated in June 1885. Then we came on to the University of Georgia, entering the Sophomore Class and graduating three years later on July 11, 1888. Returning to the University that fall, he graduated with the degree of Bachelor of Law the following year. During our first two years we were roommates in the old Sumney House on the campus. He was a member of the Phi Kappa Society, the Chi Phi fraternity, and an orator and debater of ability. He was Sophomore declaimer, a Junior orator, a Senior orator, and anniversary of the Phi Kappa Society as well as an honor man in his classes. For a while he practiced law with his father and his brother, Arnold Broyles. In 1892 he was appointed United States Commissioner for the Northern District of Georgia, serving in that office until 1899 when he was elected as Recorder of the City of Atlanta. Until 1914 he served efficiently in that office and made a great reputation for fairness and fearlessness in his decisions. In 1914 he was elected as a judge on the Georgia Court of Appeals and is justly regarded as one of the ablest members of the Georgia judiciary. When the Alpha of Georgia Chapter of Phi Beta Kappa was established at the University of Georgia, Judge Broyles, on account of his high scholarship, was elected as a

member. He ~~was~~ served as a member of the Court of Appeals for the ~~past twenty-~~ ^{thirty-three} ~~eight~~ ^{thirty-three} years (1847) ~~and has just been re-elected for another term of six years.~~ ^{was to the top of the Court}

In 1894 he married Miss Harriet Deas Hall, of South Carolina. In religion Judge Broyles ~~was always~~ ^{was} a devout member of the Episcopal Church. While in college he was a thorough athlete, strong and vigorous in physique, temperate in life, democratic to the core, fair and just, ~~then~~ ^{was} as he ~~has~~ ^{was} always ~~been~~ on the bench. In sports he took great interest in baseball, especially in the fielding positions. Throughout his life he ~~has been~~ ^{was} quite active in civic and social affairs.

FRANK WEST COILE was born in Georgia in 1864, married Miss Annie Speir and was the father of several well-known children. He was a member of the Demosthenian Society and during his college days was one of the best students in the class. After graduating he attended a medical college and on receiving his degree returned to his home in Winterville, Ga., where he practiced his profession for more than fifty years, passing away after having lived a most useful life and well beyond the three score and ten milestone. On the occasion of his funeral it was my privilege to pay a brief tribute to his splendid life. He was one of those royal souls that never sought the limelight, the gentle, Christian, lovable, self-sacrificing country physician, who throughout the years, far from the madding crowd, ministered to thousands who fairly worshipped him.

HUGH MOSS COMER was born in Alabama in 1868. He came of a distinguished family. His father was Hugh M. Comer, of Savannah, Ga., a leading financier and business man of that city. One of his uncles, E.T. Comer, was one of Georgia's leading industrialists, up to the time of his death, head of the great Bibb Manufacturing Company. Another uncle, Braxton B. Comer, was governor of Alabama, and a leading figure in the affairs of that state. Hugh was a member of the Demosthenian Society and the Kappa Alpha fraternity. He was a handsome boy and popular with his many friends. He was married to Miss Elizabeth Hanley. Possessed of a good estate, he devoted his attention for several years to his plantations in southeast Georgia. In 1898 he volunteered ~~into~~ into the ~~army~~


