 The collection is organized in four series: (1) People, (2) Events and Activities, (3) Geographic Locations, (4) Artistic Images, and (5) Collected Images. The contents in each series are arranged alphabetically.

Notes: The Kenneth Rogers photograph collection is comprised of images Rogers took as head of the Photography Department and Director of Magazine Photography at the Atlanta Constitution and the Atlanta Journal-Constitution from 1930 to 1972. Also included are the original negatives of other staff photographers and copy negatives which Rogers collected. The collection offers important documentation on a wide variety of personalities, events, and geographic locations in Atlanta and throughout Georgia. Early photographs consist of 4x5 glass plate negatives, but most of the material is captured on acetate film and color transparencies. Kenneth Rogers was born on February 26, 1907 in Camack, Georgia. His family moved to Atlanta in 1915 where Kenneth attended Tech High School. In 1923, Rogers began a 49-year career with the Atlanta Constitution as an office assistant. He dropped out of school during his senior year in order to go to work at the paper full time. Rogers was named as head of the Photography Department at the Constitution in 1930 and retained that position until 1952. When the Atlanta Constitution and the Atlanta Journal were merged in 1952, he became the Director of Magazine Photography and remained in this position until his retirement in 1972. An exceptional photographer, Rogers covered important news events in Atlanta and Georgia, and captured scenes from the Georgia countryside. Despite several changes in photographic technology, Rogers used large format (4x5) cameras his entire career. As a measure of his reputation, he was invited to the Eastman/Kodak labs in Rochester, New York to be one of the first group of photographers to experiment and train in the use of Ektachrome Color Film. Many of his photographs were used in calendars which were printed throughout the country. For many years he was the exclusive photographer for Rich's Inc. Mr. Rogers died September

11, 1989, after battling lung cancer several years.

Notes: In 1965, the Atlanta Town Committee began a project to take pictures of every courthouse in the state of Georgia. This collection contains color photographs of all 159 Georgia courthouses. Photographs of historical markers and county signs are also included. The photographers were Bertha Green and Edwin Elliot. The National Society of the Colonial Dames of America was founded in 1891 in Philadelphia. Among its objects and purposes are "to preserve historical manuscripts and public and private records; to publish historical books of reference; to mark sites of notable events and historic buildings." The Society awards scholarships and prizes to encourage the study of history, to arouse interest in the heritage of the past. Membership is open to women who are legitimately descended from a person who served one or more of the thirteen colonies by providing service to the colony between May 13, 1607 and April 19, 1775. The Georgia Chapter was initiated in 1893, and is composed of 17 Town Committees. Established in 1898, Atlanta was the first of these Town Committees. Finding aid available in repository.

Notes: The collection consists of 2 ambrotypes, 3 tintypes, 2 daguerreotypes, and 3 albumen prints of various members of the Dorsey and Kirpatrick families. John C. Kirkpatrick descended from two pioneer families of the Atlanta GA area, the Kirkpatricks and the Paces. Born in 1844, he served in the Civil War and founded the Kirkpatrick Hardware Co. He died in 1905. Rufus T. Dorsey was born in 1848; he served as a legislator, judge, and Atlanta city councilman and alderman. He died in 1909. Hugh Manson Dorsey was born 1871; he attained nationwide recognition when as Solicitor General of the Atlanta Circuit Court he led in the prosecution and conviction of Leo M. Frank in 1913 for the murder of Mary Phagan. He served as Georgia's Governor, 1916-1921. In 1926 he was appointed Judge of the Civil Division of the Atlanta Municipal Court, serving until 1935 when he became Judge of the Superior Court. He died in 1948.
