

Dear Mr. Smith:

In 2006 the Court of Appeals of Georgia will celebrate its 100th Anniversary. The Court would like to produce a video that documents its history from 1895 (first introduced as an idea) to the present. The content is to include:

- ▶ How the Court was conceptualized from idea to reality
- ▶ Which persons were influential in the creation of the Court and which decisions are fundamental throughout the Court's 100th year existence
- ▶ How technology has made an impact on the Court in recent years

We are asking the "Georgia Civil Justice Foundation" for a grant of not less than \$30,000 to assist with this production. The Court owns video equipment so the money would be used for other production services such as: research and script writing, duplications and distribution, travel expenses, fees and permits, voice-over services and GTA television facility rentals. Attached is a budget which details the services and costs.

When the project is completed copies will be made available to all Georgia public school districts, public libraries, and other educational institutions. Broadcast quality copies will also be made for consideration to be aired on Georgia Public Broadcasting, the History Channel, and other local and national television channels which show possible interest.


