Subject: Cardkey and ID replacements

It has become necessary since the issuance of the GBA Cardkey and ID Policy to clarify whether or not a fee will be assessed when a person comes to the Cardkey office for a replacement Cardkey and/or ID.

IDs - IDs that have become faded will be replaced without charge. IDs replaced due to loss, damage beyond normal card reader use, name change, or agency change will require a \$10 payment.

Cardkey- Cardkeys that no longer work and those that have only the clip retainer hole broken will be replaced without charge. Cardkeys replaced due to loss, breakage, extra holes punched or heat damage will require a \$20 payment.

Cardkeys and/or IDs that are stolen will be replaced at no charge if the employee brings a police report with them to the Cardkey office. This report must be brought when the new card is issued or there will be a charge.

If the Agency Cardkey Coordinator is made aware of unusual circumstances that explain loss or damage due to activities required of the employee, the Agency Cardkey Coordinator should indicate on the form faxed to the Cardkey office that the agency will pay for the replacement.

It is the requesting Agency Cardkey Coordinator's responsibility to determine by these guidelines whether the agency or the employee will be responsible for the charge and to note it on the faxed form.

JUDICIAL NOMINATING COMMISSION

In 1972, Governor Carter became the first Georgia governor to establish a judicial nominating commission by executive order. Subsequent governors have followed Carter's example. Under the current executive order, the judicial nominating commission recommends candidates to fill vacancies on the supreme court, court of appeals, superior court, and state court. The commission consists of eighteen members who are appointed by the governor and who serve at his pleasure. Appointments to the commission are "made with a view toward equitable geographic representation and . . . reflect the diversity of the State's citizenry." The commission recommends five candidates to the governor for each judicial vacancy, unless fewer than five applicants are found to be qualified. There is no requirement that the governor appoint a candidate from the nominating commission's list. For more information, see Judicial Merit Selection: Current Status.

REMOVAL OF JUDGES

Georgia judges may be removed in one of two ways:

- The judicial qualifications commission may discipline, retire, or remove a judge. Removal and retirement decisions must be reviewed by the supreme court.
- Judges may be impeached by the house of representatives and convicted by a two-thirds vote of the senate.
