

The following order was passed:

BRENDA PARKER v. DEPARTMENT OF BEHAVIORAL HEALTH et al.

The petition for a writ of certiorari is denied. The motions to consolidate this case with Parker v. Clark, Case No. S13A0154, and to suspend consideration of the petition for certiorari until this Court disposes of that case, are also denied.

Denied. All the Justices concur, except Blackwell, J., disqualified.
